

## **The Year for Savings**

A new tax credit is available to households that make energy-efficient upgrades.

People across the Northwest can combine this credit with local utility rebates to save the most money while making their home energy efficient and comfortable. Tax credits and local utility incentives may now be available for the following upgrades:

Upgrade	Federal Tax Credit 30% of cost, up to cap listed below*	<b>Potential Utility Incentives</b> Incentives vary by local utility. Contact your local utility for details.
Insulation	\$1,200	\$2.35 per square foot
Windows	\$600	\$6.00 per square foot
Exterior doors	\$500 or \$250 each	\$40 each
Heat pumps	\$2,000	\$1,200
Heat pump water heaters	Up to \$2,000	\$900
Other Energy Efficiency Upgrades		
Home Energy Audits	\$150	
Electric panel or circuit upgrades for new electric equipment	\$600

- **Tax Credits:** To provide support for energy-efficient upgrades, tax credits from the Inflation Reduction Act are available until 2032. The credit is claimed on your federal tax return for the year the upgrade was purchased. Check with your tax consultant for eligibility and visit the **ENERGY STAR®** and **IRS** websites for details.
- Local Rebates: Increased cash rebates are now available from your local utility for specific energyefficient upgrades. Check with your local utility about availability.
- **Eligibility:** Requirements may vary between local and federal programs. Work with a trusted local contractor to confirm that your project meets requirements for both.
